*Review Prior Concepts***Solve the trigonometric equation for x .**

1) $\cos^2 x - 1 = 0$

2) $\tan x - \sec x \cos x = 0$

Double-Angle Identities

$\sin 2A =$

$\cos 2A =$

$\tan 2A =$

*Examples***Solve for x on $[0, 2\pi)$.**

1) $\sin 2x = \sin x$

2) $\cos 2x = \cos x$

Prove the identity.

1) $\cos 6x = 2 \cos^2 3x - 1$

2) $2 \cot 2x = \cot x - \tan x$

3) $\sin 3x = \sin x (3 - 4 \sin^2 x)$
